HOW TO RECOVER WHAT IS LOST

Introduction to A-Z Recovery Luke 2:41-51

41 Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the Festival of the Passover. 42 When He was twelve years old, they went up to the festival, according to the custom. 43 After the festival was over, while His parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it. 44 Thinking He was in their company, they traveled on for a day. Then they began looking for Him among their relatives and friends. 45 When they did not find Him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for Him. **46** *After three days they found Him in the temple courts, sitting* among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. 47 Everyone who heard Him was amazed at His understanding and His answers. 48 When His parents saw Him, they were astonished. His mother said to Him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you."

49 "Why were you searching for me?" He asked. "Didn't you know I had to be in My Father's house?" **50** But they did not understand what He was saying to them.

51 Then He went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart.

FIVE WAYS THAT WE SHOULD RESPOND TO LOSS:

1. <u>RELEASE</u> MY GRIEF.

Why? Because loss always creates strong emotions.

2. <u>RECEIVE</u> FROM OTHERS.

"Carry each other's burdens... By helping each other with your troubles, you obey the Law of Christ." Galatians 6:2 (NCV)

3. <u>REFUSE</u> TO BE BITTER.

How do you keep from being bitter when the inevitable losses are going to come?

- You accept what cannot be changed.
- You focus on what's left, not what's lost.

4. <u>REMEMBER</u> WHAT IS IMPORTANT.

Jesus said, "Life is not measured by how much one owns." Luke 12:15 (NCV)

5. <u>RELY</u> ON CHRIST.

Christians get to approach tragedy and loss differently than the rest of the world. We get to rely completely on Christ. We get to have hope.
