I. Jesus was ugly to the world.

II. Jesus was ugly for <u>vou</u>.

"Surely He took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered Him stricken by God, smitten by Him, and afflicted. But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all... For He was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people He was stricken." Isaiah 53:4-6, 8b NIV

Infirmity – a bodily ailment or disease Transgression – violation of God's law Iniquity – injustice
